NARAL Pro-Choice California is dedicated to protecting and expanding reproductive freedom for all people. For more than 50 years, NARAL has worked to guarantee that every person has the right to make personal decisions regarding the full range of reproductive choices, including preventing unintended pregnancy, bearing healthy children, and choosing legal abortion.

Dear Friends,

This year has been the worst year for abortion rights nationally since the landmark decision in *Roe v. Wade*. In 2021 alone, anti-choice extremists introduced, advanced, or passed more than 330 bills in states across the country attacking abortion access, and over 100 restrictions on abortion access have been enacted at the state level.

With the Supreme Court allowing Texas to render *Roe v. Wade* meaningless in the state, and with the Court set to issue a decision this term in a case that directly challenges *Roe*, the legal right to abortion is hanging by a thread. If the federal constitutional right to abortion is overturned nationwide, abortion could be prohibited in half of the United States—the consequences of which will be felt all across the country. California will not be immune.

If *Roe* falls, California will have an outsized role to play in helping women and pregnant people from all across the country access the care they need. The question for Californians to ask ourselves is not whether abortion will remain legal here in the Golden State, but will California be prepared to provide care to the thousands upon thousands of people who cannot get care in their own states?

It is with this urgency in mind that NARAL Pro-Choice California is releasing its first Reproductive Freedom Legislative Scorecard in more than twenty years. The scorecard uses a robust methodology that allows elected officials, advocates, and members of the public to see a nuanced picture of the ways in which state legislators are—or are not—advancing reproductive freedom.

In California, we take great pride that a strong majority of state legislators support reproductive freedom and expanding abortion access—a testament to their values and conviction. However, this is just the starting point for California to truly live up to our designation as a Reproductive Freedom State. This legislative scorecard is designed to recognize our champions for reproductive freedom and to incentivize legislators to strive to achieve champion status.

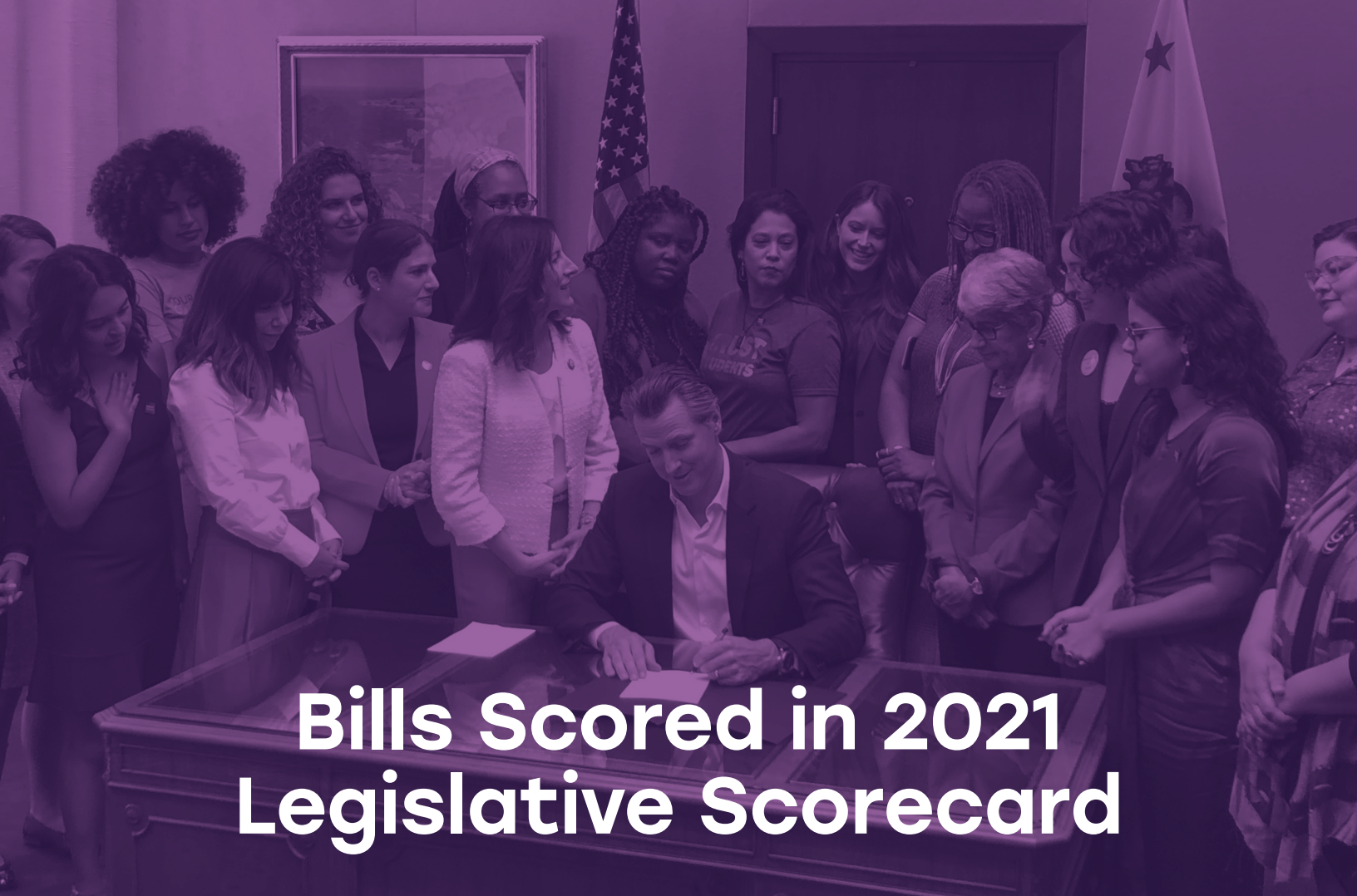
The 2021 legislative session gives us insight into California's preparedness to meet this moment should *Roe* fall and abortion rights go back to the states. Of the 15 proactive reproductive freedom bills scored this year, just seven of them were signed into law or accomplished through this year's budget, a low success rate for a state like California. Some major accomplishments included passing the California Momnibus to reduce California's alarmingly high rates of Black and Indigenous maternal mortality; expanding access to menstrual products in middle schools, high schools, and colleges; and providing reparations to survivors of forced and involuntary sterilization. Among the bills that stalled this year, however, were major bills to expand access to abortion care and birth control, a bill to curtail denials of reproductive and gender-inclusive care, and a bill to expand access to family leave.

As we look ahead to 2022, NARAL Pro-Choice California and our nearly 300,000 members statewide look to our legislators to build on California's long history as a national leader on reproductive freedom. We have much to be proud of, but also much still to do. We hope that in reviewing this year's scorecard, legislators and community members alike will use this as a baseline and as an opportunity to step up and step into the role that is demanded of us on the national stage.

Bills Scored in 2021 Legislative Scorecard

SCORED PROACTIVE REPRODUCTIVE FREEDOM BILLS

SENATE BILL 65, *California Momnibus: Reimagining Maternal Health*, authored by Senator Nancy Skinner (NARAL-SPONSORED)

SB 65 reimagines maternal health in order to improve perinatal outcomes, close racial disparities in maternal and infant mortality and morbidity, and improve data collection and research on socioeconomic factors that contribute to negative birth outcomes.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on October 4, 2021; key elements were also included in the Budget Act of 2021

SENATE BILL 245, *Abortion Accessibility Act*, authored by Senator Lena Gonzalez (NARAL-SPONSORED)

SB 245 removes cost-sharing (deductibles and copays) for abortion care so that no one in California is unable to access abortion because of the cost of the service.

Status: Made into a 2-year bill in the Asm. Appropriations Committee

SENATE BILL 306, *STD Coverage + Care Act*, authored by Senator Richard Pan (NARAL-SUPPORTED)

SB 306 expands access to STI testing remotely at home and in the community, increases access to STI treatment for patients and their partners, and updates state law to boost congenital syphilis screening in the face of alarming increases in maternal-child transmission.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on October 4, 2021

SENATE BILL 374 authored by Senator Dave Min (NARAL-SUPPORTED)

SB 374 provides necessary clarity to California's definition of domestic violence by adding reproductive coercion to the Domestic Violence Prevention Act (DVPA). Reproductive coercion is experienced by many domestic violence survivors. SB 374 helps to empower domestic survivors to identify the abuse they have experienced.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on July 23, 2021

SENATE BILL 379, *Equitable and Inclusive UC Healthcare Act*, authored by Senator Scott Wiener (NARAL-SPONSORED)

SB 379 ensures that the University of California Health system provides the same high level of care to patients whether they are receiving care at UC Health medical centers or at healthcare facilities that the UC Health system contracts with, by guaranteeing that all UC healthcare providers and students practicing in non-UC facilities are able to provide comprehensive reproductive and LGBTQ-inclusive healthcare.

Status: Made into a 2-year bill in the Sen. Appropriations Committee

SENATE BILL 523, *Contraceptive Equity Act of 2021*, authored by Senator Connie Leyva (NARAL-SPONSORED)

SB 523 expands and modernizes birth control access in California, and ensures greater contraceptive equity statewide by making California's contraceptive equity laws gender inclusive; requiring coverage of over-the-counter birth control options to increase access to time-sensitive care; extending contraceptive coverage benefits to millions of Californians including state workers, university employees, and college students; and clearly prohibiting employers from discriminating against their employees based on their contraceptive and reproductive health decisions.

Status: Made into a 2-year bill in the Asm. Appropriations Committee

ASSEMBLY BILL 32 authored by Assemblymember Cecilia Aguiar-Curry (NARAL-SUPPORTED)

AB 32 requires the State Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) to extend the telehealth flexibilities in place during the COVID-19 pandemic. Additionally, AB 32 ensures patients will continue to have access to care by maintaining parity in reimbursement for telehealth services for Medi-Cal managed care plans.

Status: Made into a 2-year bill through negotiations

ASSEMBLY BILL 123 authored by Assemblymember Lorena Gonzalez (NARAL-SUPPORTED)

AB 123 increases wage replacement rates for Californians using paid family leave and state

disability insurance (SDI). AB 123 would phase in increased wage replacement rates so that by January 2025, low income workers would receive 90% of their regular pay for the first 12 weeks of SDI and for paid family leave, while workers making more would receive 70% of their regular pay up to a cap.

Status: Vetoed by Governor Newsom on September 28, 2021

ASSEMBLY BILL 366 authored by Assemblymember Blanca Rubio (NARAL-SUPPORTED)

As introduced, AB 366 would have taken various steps to improve sexual and reproductive health outcomes for foster youth and nonminor dependents.

Status: This bill was gutted and amended with a different purpose in the Senate, and for this reason is only scored in the Assembly

ASSEMBLY BILL 367 authored by Assemblymember Cristina Garcia (NARAL-SUPPORTED)

AB 367 increases access to menstrual products in public schools maintaining grades 6-12, on community college campuses, and at California State Universities. AB 367 is a critical step toward removing barriers to equity for all Californians who menstruate.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on October 8, 2021

ASSEMBLY BILL 935 authored by Assemblymember Brian Maienschein (NARAL-SUPPORTED)

AB 935 requires health insurers and plans to develop a provider-to-provider telehealth consultation program to connect primary care providers with experts in maternal or pediatric mental health to enable providers to appropriately diagnose and best treat children and pregnant or postpartum patients experiencing a mental health disorder.

Status: Made into a 2-year bill at the decision of the bill author

ASSEMBLY BILL 1007 authored by Assemblymember Wendy Carrillo (NARAL-SUPPORTED)

AB 1007 provides reparations to survivors of forced sterilization under California's eugenics laws from 1909 to 1979 and survivors of involuntary sterilizations in women's state prisons after 1979. Additionally, AB 1007 establishes an outreach and sterilization notification program in consultation with

community-based organizations, raising awareness of the unjust sterilization of thousands of people.

Status: Achieved through the state budget on July 12, 2021

ASSEMBLY BILL 1041 authored by Assemblymember Buffy Wicks (NARAL-SUPPORTED)

AB 1041 expands the group of people for whom employees can take family and sick leave from work by allowing workers to take job-protected time off to care for a “designated person,” essentially “chosen family,” identified by the employee at the time they request family care and medical leave.

Status: Made into a 2-year bill

ASSEMBLY BILL 1184 authored by Assemblymember David Chiu (NARAL-SUPPORTED)

AB 1184 ensures patient information is protected by establishing automatic confidentiality when accessing sensitive services, and expands the existing definition of “sensitive services” to include gender-affirming care and behavioral health care.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom September 22, 2021

ASSEMBLY BILL 1356 authored by Assemblymember Rebecca Bauer-Kahan (NARAL-SUPPORTED)

AB 1356 strengthens safety and security laws to better protect patients and providers at reproductive health centers by updating the California Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances Act (FACE Act) and modernizing online privacy laws.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom September 22, 2021

SCORED ANTI-REPRODUCTIVE FREEDOM BILLS

SENATE BILL 217 authored by Senator Brian Dahle (NARAL-OPPOSED)

SB 217 imposes a one-size-fits-all requirement on California’s comprehensive sexual health education instruction, adding unnecessary barriers to the delivery of school-based comprehensive sexual health education.

Status: Held in the Senate Appropriations Committee





Methodology

NARAL Pro-Choice California's Reproductive Freedom Legislative Scorecard is designed to hold anti-choice legislators accountable and to differentiate between legislators who support reproductive freedom, and legislators who are dedicated to going above and beyond to ensure that all people can make personal decisions about their own reproductive lives and futures. The scorecard takes into account the frequency with which a legislator votes consistent with NARAL Pro-Choice California's position on bills. "No Vote Recorded" is counted as a "No" vote unless the "No Vote Recorded" is attributed to an excused absence, indicated as "ABS." The scorecard incentivizes legislators to do more than vote to advance reproductive freedom by factoring in lead authorship and co-authorship of reproductive freedom bills and taking into account other actions taken by legislators to advance or curtail reproductive freedom.

Accordingly, the 2021 scorecard methodology dictates that legislators who only vote consistently to advance reproductive freedom can earn a maximum of a "B" and are characterized as Reproductive Freedom Defenders. Legislators who lead author reproductive freedom bills receive a 7.5% increase to their score for each lead authorship. Legislators who coauthor reproductive freedom bills receive a 2.5% increase to their score for each co-authorship.

Also calculated into this year's scorecard is whether legislators signed onto the state legislator amicus brief urging the Supreme Court to uphold precedent and

strike down Mississippi's abortion ban, and whether legislators signed onto the letter to U.S. House and Senate leadership calling for passage of the Women's Health Protection Act (WHPA). Each of these sign-on actions earned legislators a 2.5% increase to their score. Finally, other applicable factors are taken into account such as: actions taken by a committee chair to prevent a reproductive freedom bill from advancing (either by holding it in committee or making it into a 2-year bill), action or inaction by leadership to advance reproductive freedom, and introducing anti-choice or hostile legislation.

NARAL Pro-Choice California scores bills in the areas of reproductive health, rights, and justice, including access to sexual and reproductive health education, information, and counseling; equitable access to comprehensive sexual and reproductive health services including increasing affordability, expanding the number and types of providers, fighting harmful restrictions on care, and more; and access to pregnancy and postpartum services and support including improving maternal health outcomes, fighting pregnancy discrimination, expanding paid family leave, and more. NARAL Pro-Choice California scores bills that it is sponsoring, supporting, and opposing. In California, organizations are able to sponsor legislation in an official capacity, in addition to being able to support legislation generally.

The Reproductive Freedom Legislative Scorecard reflects annual and not aggregated scores.



Grading Scale Definitions

(A+, A) Reproductive Freedom Champions

Champions are on the front line of the fight for reproductive freedom. These legislators not only take the right votes, they also lead author and co-author reproductive freedom bills, whip necessary committee and floor votes to advance these bills, and proactively and publicly utilize their platform to speak up and push to expand reproductive freedom.

(A-, B+) Reproductive Freedom Leaders

Leaders are strong advocates who consistently vote to advance reproductive freedom. They sometimes lead author or co-author reproductive freedom bills and may use their platform to support reproductive freedom.

(B) Reproductive Freedom Defenders

Defenders consistently vote to expand reproductive freedom and may co-author the occasional reproductive freedom bill.

(C) Legislators with Mixed Support for Reproductive Freedom

Legislators with mixed support for reproductive freedom have taken votes both in favor of and against reproductive freedom.

(D) Legislators Hostile to Reproductive Freedom

Legislators hostile to reproductive freedom may vote for some policies protecting reproductive freedom, but vote against many others.

(F) Legislators Extremely Hostile to Reproductive Freedom

Legislators extremely hostile to reproductive freedom fail in the fight for reproductive freedom. They actively and fervently work to deny Californians our fundamental rights to access reproductive healthcare.

(NEI) Not Enough Information

These legislators did not complete a full or close-to-full term and therefore did not have the opportunity to author or co-author legislation at the beginning of the session, and were not present for all or most votes scored by NARAL Pro-Choice California.
