NARAL is powered by its 4 million members, including more than 370,000 members in California, representing the 8 in 10 Americans who support legal abortion.

Dear Friends,

This year has been the worst year for reproductive freedom on record. In June, the U.S. Supreme Court overturned *Roe v. Wade*, ending the constitutional right to abortion and allowing states to enforce total and extreme bans on abortion. This decision eviscerated federal constitutional protections for abortion access, sending a clear and terrifying message to Americans: Our freedom to determine if, when, and how to start or grow a family is now gone for many people across the country. Emboldened by the Supreme Court decision, anti-choice lawmakers are racing to ban abortion in roughly half of the United States, with more than a dozen states already enforcing total or extreme bans.

California is proudly leading the fight to protect and expand access for all people. In response to nation-wide attacks on reproductive freedom, in September, 2021, NARAL Pro-Choice California and our allies formed the California Future of Abortion Council (CA FAB Council) to create a [blueprint](#) for California and states like ours to safeguard and expand abortion access. This year, the CA FAB Council, together with the CA Legislative Women's Caucus, introduced the largest and most comprehensive bill package protecting abortion access in the country. In total, the CA FAB Council package was comprised of 17 bills, including State Constitutional Amendment 10 to specifically enshrine the right to abortion and contraception in our state constitution.

California has long played an outsized role in ensuring that all people can access the critical abortion care they need. Even before *Roe v. Wade* was overturned, California was home to 1 in 4 healthcare facilities in the country that provide abortion care. Now, as providers and clinics in states all across the United States are forced to stop providing care, that percentage is increasing exponentially.

Fortunately, California's state legislators rose to the occasion. In this year's legislative scorecard, 22 of the 24 priorities scored advanced under the leadership of Senate pro Tem Toni Atkins, and Legislative Women's Caucus Chair Cristina Garcia and Vice Chair Nancy Skinner. Of those, 20 of the 24 bills advanced to Governor Newsom for signature, SCA 10 qualified for the November ballot as Proposition 1, and AB 2529 (Calderon/Davies) was accomplished entirely through the 2022-23 budget. Some major accomplishments in the CA FAB Council bill package include:

- Addressing cost barriers and stabilizing our provider network by reimbursing abortion providers who provide care to patients at low or no cost
- Addressing California's provider shortages by increasing training opportunities, ensuring nurse practitioners can provide first-trimester abortion care independently, and investing in a diverse workforce
- Providing legal protections for abortion patients, providers, and supporting organizations and individuals
- Addressing disinformation and ensuring access to medically accurate, culturally relevant, and inclusive education about abortion, including by creating abortion.ca.gov
- Providing direct practical support to patients seeking abortion care

SB 523 (Leyva), NARAL’s-sponsored bill to promote contraceptive equity, as well as various bills to expand access to paid family leave, are also among the bills that advanced through the legislature this year. Just two bills, AB 2029 (Wicks) and AB 2080 (Wood) failed to advance this session.

NARAL Pro-Choice California’s Reproductive Freedom Legislative Scorecard is designed to recognize our champions for reproductive freedom and to incentivize legislators to strive to achieve champion status. The 2022 scorecard illustrates just how much California legislators stepped up to champion reproductive freedom this year. In the 2021 scorecard, 41 legislators earned the “Champion” designation, with 17 legislators earning an A+ and 24 earning an A. This year, 56 legislators — nearly half of all members of the California legislature — earned the “Champion” designation, with 38 legislators earning an A+ and an additional 18 earning an A. Altogether, 80 legislators earned the designation of “Reproductive Freedom Champion” or “Reproductive Freedom Leader” in the 2022 scorecard, compared to 66 legislators who earned these designations in 2021.

While this year was extremely challenging, NARAL Pro-Choice California remains focused and dedicated to the work of protecting and expanding reproductive freedom for *every* body. This fall, the CA FAB Council will reconvene to discuss evolving challenges and barriers to care, and utilizing our [checklist](#) as a guide, we will build out the 2023 CA FAB Council package. NARAL Pro-Choice California and our more than 370,000 members statewide look forward to working with legislative leadership and Governor Newsom to ensure that California continues to lead with our values.

Bills Scored in 2022 Legislative Scorecard

SENATE CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT 10
authored by Senate pro Tempore Toni Atkins and
Assembly Speaker Anthony Rendon (NARAL-
Sponsored | CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Amends the state Constitution to prohibit the state from denying or interfering with an individual's reproductive freedom, and declares that individuals have a fundamental right to choose to have an abortion and to use or refuse birth control.

Status: Passed the legislature with the requisite $\frac{2}{3}$ vote to qualify for the November ballot.

SENATE BILL 245, Abortion Accessibility Act,
authored by Senator Lena Gonzalez (NARAL-
Sponsored | CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Removes cost-sharing (deductibles and co-pays) for abortion care so that no one in California is unable to access care because of the cost of the service.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on March, 22, 2022.

SENATE BILL 523, Contraceptive Equity Act
of 2021, authored by Senator Connie Leyva
(NARAL-Sponsored)

Ensures greater contraceptive equity regardless of an individual's gender identity, insurance coverage status, or place of employment.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 27, 2022

SENATE BILL 951 authored by Senator María
Elena Durazo (NARAL-Supported)

Increases wage replacement rates for California's Paid Family Leave and State Disability Insurance programs to ensure that California's paid leave programs are accessible to all Californians.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 29, 2022

SENATE BILL 1058 authored by Senator María
Elena Durazo (NARAL-Supported)

Requires the Employment Development Department to collect race and ethnicity data from Paid Family

Leave and State Disability Insurance claimants to help ensure equitable access to Paid Family Leave and State Disability Insurance programs.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 13, 2022

SENATE BILL 1142 authored by Senator Anna Caballero & Senator Nancy Skinner (NARAL-Sponsored | CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Creates a fund for organizations that provide practical and logistical support to patients who need help overcoming barriers to accessing abortion care. The bill also establishes a website with comprehensive information regarding accessing abortion care in California.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 27, 2022

SENATE BILL 1245 authored by Senator Sydney Kamlager (CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Establishes a reproductive health pilot project in Los Angeles County to support innovative approaches and patient-centered collaborations to safeguard patient access to abortions, regardless of residency.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 27, 2022

SENATE BILL 1375 authored by Senate pro Tempore Toni Atkins (CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Allows nurse practitioners that meet specified criteria and training requirements to provide first-trimester abortion independently.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 27, 2022

ASSEMBLY BILL 32 authored by Assemblymember Aguiar-Curry (NARAL-Supported)

Requires the State Department of Health Care Services (DHCS) to extend the telehealth flexibilities in place during the COVID-19 Pandemic. Additionally, AB 32 ensures patients will continue to have access to care by maintaining parity in reimbursement for telehealth services for Medi-Cal managed care plans.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 25, 2022

ASSEMBLY BILL 657 authored by Assemblymember Jim Cooper (CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Requires the Medical Board of California, the Osteopathic Medical Board of California, the Board of Registered Nursing, and the Physician Assistant Board to expedite the licensure process of an applicant who can demonstrate that they intend to provide abortion services within their scope of practice.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 27, 2022

ASSEMBLY BILL 1041 authored by Assemblymember Buffy Wicks (NARAL-Supported)

Expands the definition of “family member” for purposes of family and sick leave to allow workers to take job-protected time off to care for “an individual related by blood or whose association with the employee is the equivalent of a family relationship.”

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 29, 2022

ASSEMBLY BILL 1242 authored by Assemblymember Rebecca Bauer-Kahan (CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Protects California providers and patients from specified law enforcement actions that stem from any investigations based on providing or accessing abortion that is legally allowed under California law. Specifically, this bill prohibits California law enforcement and California corporations from cooperating with out-of-state entities regarding a lawful abortion in California and would prohibit an arrest in California of someone who provides, aids in the performance of, or receives an abortion in California.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 27, 2022

ASSEMBLY BILL 1666 authored by Assemblymember Rebecca Bauer-Kahan (CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Protects patients and providers in California from civil liability judgments for providing

reproductive health care to patients when the claims are based on laws in other states that are hostile to abortion rights and are contrary to the public policy of California.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on June 24, 2022.

ASSEMBLY BILL 1918 authored by Assemblymember Cottie Petrie-Norris (CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Creates the California Reproductive Health Scholarship Corps, responsible for recruiting, training, and retaining a diverse workforce of health care professionals who will provide reproductive health services, including abortion, in underserved areas of California.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 27, 2022

ASSEMBLY BILL 2029 authored by Assemblymember Buffy Wicks (NARAL-Supported)

Reduces discrimination and increases equity in coverage for infertility treatment.

Status: Inactive. Held in the Assembly Appropriations Committee.

ASSEMBLY BILL 2080, Health Care Consolidation and Contracting Fairness Act of 2022, authored by Assemblymember Jim Wood (NARAL-Supported)

Protects comprehensive reproductive and LGBTQ-inclusive healthcare access in all regions of the state by strengthening and expanding the oversight of the California Attorney General over new health care mergers, acquisitions, and other transactions and prohibiting anti-competitive contracting practices.

Status: Inactive. Held in the Senate Health Committee.

ASSEMBLY BILL 2091 authored by Assemblymember Mia Bonta (CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Enhances privacy protections for medical records related to abortion care under California's Reproductive Privacy Act and protects against disclosures to law enforcement and out-of-state

third parties seeking to enforce hostile abortion bans in other states.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 27, 2022

ASSEMBLY BILL 2134, California Abortion and Reproductive Equity Act, authored by Dr. Akilah Weber (NARAL-Sponsored | CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Establishes a program to reimburse abortion providers who provide care to patients with low incomes and those who face financial barriers to accessing abortion and contraception.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 27, 2022

ASSEMBLY BILL 2205 authored by Assemblymember Wendy Carrillo (CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Requires the qualified health plans under Covered California to report annually to the Department of Insurance and Department of Managed Health Care the total amounts of funds collected in the segregated accounts (established under the Affordable Care Act to hold premium payment of \$1 per member per month and from which claims for abortions must be paid) to better understand how much money is currently in those accounts and how much is being used each year to pay claims.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 27, 2022

ASSEMBLY BILL 2223 authored by Assemblymember Buffy Wicks (NARAL-Sponsored | CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Ensures that no one in California will be investigated, prosecuted, or incarcerated for ending a pregnancy or experiencing pregnancy loss.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 27, 2022

ASSEMBLY BILL 2320 authored by Assemblymember Cristina Garcia (CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Establishes and administers a pilot program to direct funds to community health clinics that

provide reproductive health care services in five counties and requires a participating health clinic to undertake specified activities to improve health care delivery for marginalized patients.

Status: Vetoed by Governor Newsom on September 22, 2022

ASSEMBLY BILL 2529 authored by Assemblymember Laurie Davies & Assemblymember Lisa Calderon (CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Expands the Song-Brown Workforce Training Act to include Certified Nurse-Midwifery and Licensed Midwifery training programs. Adding these training programs as eligible applicants for Song-Brown funding will increase Californians' access to high-quality maternity care providers throughout the State.

Status: Achieved through the state budget on June 28, 2022 (SB 154)

ASSEMBLY BILL 2586 authored by Assemblymember Cristina Garcia & Assemblymember Luz Rivas (CA Future of Abortion Council bill)


Establishes the California Reproductive Justice and Freedom Fund to support community-based organizations to provide medically accurate, culturally congruent, comprehensive reproductive and sexual health education, inclusive of abortion, to disproportionately impacted communities.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 27, 2022

ASSEMBLY BILL 2626 authored by Assemblymember Lisa Calderon (CA Future of Abortion Council bill)

Protects abortion providers in California by prohibiting the removal or suspension of medical licenses for a licensee providing abortion care in California who is complying with California law.

Status: Signed into law by Governor Newsom on September 27, 2022





Methodology

NARAL Pro-Choice California's Reproductive Freedom Legislative Scorecard is designed to hold anti-choice legislators accountable and to differentiate between legislators who support reproductive freedom, and legislators who are dedicated to going above and beyond to ensure that all people can make personal decisions about their own reproductive lives and futures. The scorecard takes into account the frequency with which a legislator votes consistent with NARAL Pro-Choice California's position on bills. "No Vote Recorded" is counted as a "No" vote unless the "No Vote Recorded" is attributed to an excused absence, indicated as "ABS."


The scorecard incentivizes legislators to do more than vote to advance reproductive freedom by factoring in lead authorship and co-authorship of reproductive freedom bills and taking into account other actions taken by legislators to advance or curtail reproductive freedom.

Accordingly, the 2022 scorecard methodology dictates that legislators who only vote consistently to advance reproductive freedom can earn a maximum of a "B" and are characterized as Reproductive Freedom Defenders. Legislators who lead author reproductive freedom bills receive a 7.5% increase to their score for each lead authorship. Legislators who coauthor reproductive freedom bills receive a 2.5% increase to their score for each co-authorship.

Also calculated into this year's scorecard is whether legislators specifically co-authored Senate Constitutional Amendment 10. Coauthoring SCA 10 earned legislators a 5% increase to their score. Finally, other applicable factors are taken into account such as: actions taken by a committee chair to prevent a reproductive freedom bill from advancing (either by holding it in committee or refusing to hold a hearing on the bill), and actions by leadership to advance reproductive freedom.

NARAL Pro-Choice California scores bills in the areas of reproductive health, rights, and justice, including access to sexual and reproductive health education, information, and counseling; equitable access to comprehensive sexual and reproductive health services including increasing affordability, expanding the number and types of providers, fighting harmful restrictions on care, and more; and access to pregnancy and postpartum services and support including improving maternal health outcomes, fighting pregnancy discrimination, expanding paid family leave, and more. NARAL Pro-Choice California scores bills that it is sponsoring, supporting, and opposing. In California, organizations are able to sponsor legislation in an official capacity, in addition to being able to support legislation generally.

The Reproductive Freedom Legislative Scorecard reflects annual and not aggregated scores.



Grading Scale Definitions

(A+, A) Reproductive Freedom Champions

Champions are on the front line of the fight for reproductive freedom. These legislators not only take the right votes, they also lead author and co-author reproductive freedom bills, whip necessary committee and floor votes to advance these bills, and proactively and publicly utilize their platform to speak up and push to expand reproductive freedom.

(A-, B+) Reproductive Freedom Leaders

Leaders are strong advocates who consistently vote to advance reproductive freedom. They sometimes lead author or co-author reproductive freedom bills and may use their platform to support reproductive freedom.

(B) Reproductive Freedom Defenders

Defenders consistently vote to expand reproductive freedom and may co-author the occasional reproductive freedom bill.

(C) Legislators with Mixed Support for Reproductive Freedom

Legislators with mixed support for reproductive freedom have taken votes both in favor of and against reproductive freedom.

(D) Legislators Hostile to Reproductive Freedom

Legislators hostile to reproductive freedom may vote for some policies protecting reproductive freedom, but vote against many others.

(F) Legislators Extremely Hostile to Reproductive Freedom

Legislators extremely hostile to reproductive freedom fail in the fight for reproductive freedom. They actively and fervently work to deny Californians our fundamental rights to access reproductive health care.

(NEI) Not Enough Information

These legislators did not complete a full or close-to-full term and therefore did not have the opportunity to author or co-author legislation at the beginning of the session, and were not present for all or most votes scored by NARAL Pro-Choice California.
