CONGRESSIONAL RECORD ON REPRODUCTIVE FREEDOM 119TH CONGRESS, 1ST SESSION

Reproductive Freedom for All's 2025 Congressional Record on Reproductive Freedom tracks key House and Senate votes related to reproductive freedom during the first session of the 119th Congress.

For over 55 years, our organization and members have helped lead the charge to protect and advance reproductive freedom through grassroots organizing, electoral change, and political advocacy at both the state and national levels. This scorecard reflects how members of Congress used their power during a pivotal year—the first of the second Trump Administration—defined by relentless republican-led attacks on abortion, reproductive freedom, and our democracy itself.

The Republican Trifecta's Agenda to Attack Reproductive Freedom and Democracy

Trump and the Republican trifecta are pursuing the most radical anti-abortion, anti-democracy agenda in modern history rooted in the Project 2025 blueprint. A 900-page extremist agenda, Project 2025 lays out the coordinated strategy to dismantle democratic institutions, strip away fundamental rights, and roll back reproductive freedom—and it's already well underway. After spending the 2024 campaign disavowing and distancing themselves from Project 2025, Trump and his Republican allies moved swiftly to operationalize it, implementing half of its proposals in less than one year. Nearly 50% of Project 2025 proposals targeting reproductive freedom have already been implemented or are in process. Given this rapid pace, dire harm could continue over the next three years.

Federal Agencies Weaponized Against Reproductive Health Care

A key component of this strategy involves replacing career civil servants with political loyalists and weaponizing federal agencies against the very people they are meant to serve. Immediately following the election, Trump nominated individuals with extensive anti-abortion records to his cabinet and key roles in the administration, including Pam Bondi as U.S. Attorney General, Russell Vought as Director of the White House Office of Management and Budget, Robert Kennedy Jr. as Secretary of Health and Human

Services, Martin Makary as Commissioner of the Food and Drug Administration, and Mehmet Oz as Administrator of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

Under their leadership, federal agencies moved swiftly to attack reproductive freedom. The administration's first abuses included rolling back enforcement of the Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances (FACE) Act, emboldening perpetrators of anti-abortion violence and harassment. Trump has pardoned individuals convicted of FACE Act violations, while Republicans in Congress have attempted to repeal the law altogether and even misuse it against reproductive rights advocates. These actions have fueled a surge in anti-abortion extremism, including threats to providers and coordinated attacks on clinics.

Furthermore, the Department of Veterans Affairs reversed its policy allowing VA facilities to provide abortion care in cases of rape, incest, or when the patient's health is at risk—sacrificing veterans' health by stripping care from those who served our country. The administration froze Title X family planning funding, threatening the nationwide network of clinics that provide affordable contraception, cancer screenings, and other essential health care to millions of patients. It has gutted enforcement of EMTALA—the federal law requiring hospitals to provide emergency medical care, including abortion care—endangering patients' lives and inflicting chaos and confusion for providers in moments of crisis. Together, these actions reflect a deliberate and escalating effort to dismantle reproductive freedom through executive power.

Medication Abortion in the Crosshairs

Mifepristone remains a central target of the anti-abortion movement because medication abortion now accounts for approximately 63% of all abortion care in the country. Ignoring decades of peer-reviewed scientific evidence confirming mifepristone's safety, HHS Secretary Robert F. Kennedy Jr. and FDA Commissioner Martin Makary launched a politically motivated review of the medication under pressure from anti-abortion extremists. Trump-appointed lower-court allies have kept alive a dubious legal challenge to the FDA's approval of mifepristone, stoking uncertainty for providers and patients as access to the safe and effective medication remains in peril. Congressional Republicans have reinforced these efforts by introducing legislation attempting to force the FDA to withdraw mifepristone's approval entirely.

Attacks on reproductive freedom are only one part of the Project 2025 playbook. The Trump administration has escalated fear and hostility nationwide by rescinding protections and advancing harmful policies that target LGBTQIA+ and immigrant communities—stoking fear and hatred and making it harder for many to access health care, including reproductive health care.

At the same time, Trump and his allies have intensified attacks on democracy itself. Through litigation like *Louisiana v. Callais*—a Supreme Court case that threatens to severely weaken the Voting Rights Act—they are pushing efforts to disenfranchise historically marginalized communities, including communities of color, and upend the entire political landscape. In further attempts to rig the system, they have pressured key states to redraw congressional maps to tilt the scales for Republicans in the 2026 elections and moved to politicize the Department of Justice, defund watchdog agencies, and weaken checks on executive power. And with the support of Senate allies, the administration has installed extremist judges across the federal judiciary who prioritize loyalty to Trump and the erosion of fundamental rights over the rule of law and critical checks and balances.

The Courts and Congress as Battlegrounds for Reproductive Freedom

This year, the Supreme Court issued decisions that underscore how deeply access to health care now depends on the courts. In *Medina v. Planned Parenthood South Atlantic*, the Court allowed South Carolina to remove Planned Parenthood from its Medicaid program—stripping essential health care from more than a million patients and paving the way for other states to follow suit. In *Kennedy v. Braidwood*, the Court narrowly preserved the status quo on preventive care coverage under the Affordable Care Act (ACA) in a sweeping challenge to the foundation of those protections—one that could have gutted coverage for cancer screenings, HIV prevention, and ultimately contraception, and never should have reached the Court in the first place. These cases reveal that control of the courts increasingly determines the fate of our rights. Protecting reproductive freedom and health care access demands not just nominating fair-minded judges, but a commitment to democracy and meaningful court reform.

As the courts reshape the legal landscape for reproductive freedom, congressional action has further eroded health

care access and funding. During the summer, congressional Republicans passed H.R. 1, Trump’s so-called “Big Beautiful Bill,” which slashed Medicaid, “defunded” Planned Parenthood, and pushed essential reproductive health care further out of reach. Then, they triggered a historic 43-day government shutdown by refusing to support a clean extension of the expiring ACA enhanced premium tax credits that 22 million people relied on to afford their insurance coverage. Instead, Republicans let millions lose coverage, offering sham proposals that failed to extend the credits, raised health care costs, and attempted to expand abortion restrictions beyond those already embedded in the ACA. Despite the ACA’s popularity and its proven success in reducing the uninsured rate nationwide, Republicans continue their crusade against the law—using abortion as a scapegoat.

Defending Reproductive Freedom, Defending Democracy

In November 2025, voters delivered a clear rebuke to anti-abortion extremism. Every Reproductive Freedom for All-endorsed candidate won, and voters secured critical victories for abortion rights and democracy up and down the ballot in races across the country—including for governor in Virginia and New Jersey, Pennsylvania’s state supreme court, and California’s Proposition 50 ballot initiative, a significant win for redistricting reform. Exit polls in Virginia, New Jersey, and Pennsylvania confirmed that abortion was highly influential in voters’ decision-making, and candidates who centered reproductive freedom won decisively.

The contrast is unmistakable: Voters across the country show up to protect reproductive freedom while the Trump administration and its allies escalate their attacks despite clear and consistent public opposition. Because they can’t win on the merits of an anti-abortion agenda that Americans repeatedly reject, they are imposing it by weaponizing federal agencies and courts, tilting the scales against fair elections, and overriding the will of the people. With the White House and Congress advancing this anti-freedom, anti-democracy blueprint—and lifetime judicial appointments entrenching it for years—the threats to our fundamental rights are existential, and the fight is far from over. Unified opposition and accountability in Congress remain essential, protecting reproductive freedom and our democracy in 2026 and beyond.

- 1. Interference in Abortion Practice: Motion to End Debate.** Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act, S.6. Motion to invoke cloture (end debate) on the motion to proceed to a bill to interfere with the medical practice of abortion care under the threat of severe penalties. Three-fifths of the Senate (60 votes) is required to invoke cloture on legislation. Failed 52-47. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against cloture (1/22/25).
- 2. Pete Hegseth Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Pete Hegseth, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the post of Secretary of Defense. Confirmed 51-50. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (1/24/25).
- 3. Douglas Collins Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Douglas Collins, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the post of Secretary of Veterans Affairs. Confirmed 77-23. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (2/4/25).
- 4. Pam Bondi Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Pam Bondi, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the post of Attorney General. Confirmed 54-46. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (2/4/25).
- 5. Russell Vought Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Russell Vought, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the post of Director of the White House Office of Management and Budget. Confirmed 53-47. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (2/6/25).
- 6. Robert F. Kennedy Jr. Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Robert F. Kennedy Jr., a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom and healthcare access, to the post of Secretary of Health and Human Services. Confirmed 52-48. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (2/13/25).
- 7. IVF Coverage.** FY'25 budget resolution. S.Con.Res.7. Duckworth (D-IL) amendment to provide non-binding budget reconciliation instructions to expand coverage for fertility treatment services, including IVF. Failed 49-51. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was in favor of the amendment (2/21/25).
- 8. Martin Makary Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Martin Makary, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the post of Commissioner of the Food and Drug Administration. Confirmed 56-44. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (3/25/25).
- 9. Aaron Reitz Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Aaron Reitz, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the post of Assistant Attorney General for the Office of Legal Policy. Confirmed 52-46. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (3/26/25).
- 10. Harmeet Dhillon Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Harmeet Dhillon, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the post of Assistant Attorney General for civil rights. Confirmed 52-45. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (4/3/25).
- 11. John Sauer Confirmation.** Vote to confirm John Sauer, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the post of Solicitor General. Confirmed 52-45. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (4/3/25).
- 12. Mehmet Oz Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Mehmet Oz, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the post of Administrator of the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services. Confirmed 53-45. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (4/3/25).
- 13. James O'Neill Confirmation.** Vote to confirm James O'Neill, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the post of Deputy Secretary of Health and Human Services. Confirmed 52-43. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (6/5/25).

14. **Access to Hospital Maternity Services.** One Big Beautiful Bill Act, H.R.1. Motion to return the bill to committee to preserve access to hospital labor and delivery units to protect births that are financed by Medicaid. Failed 48-52. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was in favor of the motion (6/30/25).
15. **Medicaid Reimbursement to Planned Parenthood.** One Big Beautiful Bill Act, H.R.1. Murray (D-WA) amendment to strike the provision to “defund” Planned Parenthood. Failed 49-51. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was in favor of the amendment (6/30/25).
16. **Attacks on Medicaid and Planned Parenthood.** One Big Beautiful Bill Act, H.R.1. Final Passage. A bill to drastically cut Medicaid funding and disqualify Planned Parenthood from participating in the program for one year. (Some anti-abortion lawmakers cast what appear to be pro-repro votes; most observers recognize that those votes were cast for reasons unrelated to reproductive health.) Passed 51-50. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against passage (7/1/25).
17. **Whitney Hermandorfer Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Whitney Hermandorfer, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Sixth Circuit. Confirmed 46-42. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (7/14/25).
18. **International Family Planning.** Rescissions Act of 2025. H.R.4. Rosen (D-NV) amendment to strike cuts to global health funding targeting family planning and reproductive health care. Failed 48-51. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was in favor of the amendment (7/16/25).
19. **Joshua Divine Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Joshua Divine, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the U.S. District Court for the Eastern and Western Districts of Missouri. Confirmed 51-46. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (7/22/25).
20. **T. Elliot Gaiser Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Elliot Gaiser, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the post of Assistant Attorney General for the Office of Legal Counsel. Confirmed 53-45. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (7/30/25).
21. **Maria Lanahan Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Maria Lanahan, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Missouri. Confirmed 52-45. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (9/9/25).
22. **Jennifer Mascott Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Jennifer Mascott, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the Third Circuit. Confirmed 50-47. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (10/9/25).
23. **William Mercer Confirmation.** Vote to confirm William Mercer, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the U.S. District Court for the District of Montana. Confirmed 52-45. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (10/22/25).
24. **Chad Meredith Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Chad Meredith, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Kentucky. Confirmed 48-45. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (10/23/25).
25. **Jordan Pratt Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Jordan Pratt, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the U.S. District Court for the Middle District of Florida. Confirmed 52-47. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (10/28/25).
26. **Edmund LaCour Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Edmund LaCour, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the U.S. District Court for the Northern District of Alabama. Confirmed 51-47. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (10/29/25).

- 27. Joshua Dunlap Confirmation.** Vote to confirm Joshua Dunlap, a nominee with a hostile record on reproductive freedom, to the U.S. Court of Appeals for the First Circuit. Confirmed 52-46. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against confirmation (11/4/25).

- 1. Interference in Abortion Practice.** Born-Alive Abortion Survivors Protection Act, H.R. 21. Final Passage. A bill to interfere with the medical practice of abortion care under the threat of severe penalties. Passed 217-204. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against passage (1/23/25).
- 2. Attacks on Medicaid and Planned Parenthood.** One Big Beautiful Bill Act, H.R.1. Final Passage. A bill to drastically cut Medicaid funding and disqualify Planned Parenthood from participating in the program for one year. Passed 215-214. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against passage (5/22/25).
- 3. Attacks on Medicaid and Planned Parenthood.** One Big Beautiful Bill Act, H.R.1. On motion to agree to the Senate-passed version of H.R. 1. (Some anti-abortion lawmakers cast what appear to be pro-repro votes; most observers recognize that those votes were cast for reasons unrelated to reproductive health.) Passed 218-214. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against the motion (7/3/25).
- 4. Abortion Coverage Ban.** Lower Health Care Premiums for All Americans Act, H.R. 6703. Final Passage. A bill to ban abortion coverage in certain health plans and to raise health care costs. Passed 216-211. A vote for reproductive freedom (+) was against passage (12/17/25).
